## The MDGs – Globalising Poverty

- The Millennium Moment provided unique opportunity to transform 'development'. It failed... a conceptual shift to 'global poverty' – MDGs, PRSPs, \$1 a day, innovative finance – but basically business as usual
- I came to research the *MDGs* suspecting they were *bullshit* I could not see them on the ground
- Not that easy to dismiss millions of actors, 1000s of organisations, 100s of venues...mixes of self-interest and altruism...many people trying to make the world better
- Formulation incredibly complex and no-one clear on the final product – 'Human development meets results-based management in an imperfect world'

### **MDG** Implementation

- MDGs could state goals but could not specify 'how' or 'who' – too contentious
- In practice, PRSPs and MTEFs meant that aidfocused countries continued with IMF and WB direction – were BWIs empowered by MDGs?
- Focus on partnerships state, business, NGOs but making poverty MoF issue was beneficial
- Finance Monterey hopes in 2002...but only small increases in aid and Gates - no major breakthrough

#### MDGs Contribution to Development

- Hard to assess most 'MDG achievement' is not related to MDGs eg China and India!
- *Optimists* breakthrough of global consensus
- **Pessimists** business as usual or con trick
- Me read the books...limited advances but a missed opportunity for transformation. 2015 will not be 2000
- Positive in UK...Negative in health in Uganda?

#### Hulme's Lessons from MDGs

- MDGs were too global national level and ownership are the real issues. How can post-2015 get Southern governments and elites to be pro-inclusive development?
- Get aid agencies into perspective bit players
- How to change social norms focus...not 'plans'
- Engage the big powers US, China, India, Brazil
- Link to climate change and sustainability?

# Post-2015 Development Agenda: Options

- Most assume it is MDGs 2.0 revised targets contests to get your target included and neoliberal versus global justice agendas
- Human rights implementation of UDHR plus
- Global *inequality* targets
- Partnership targets a real Goal 8
- Me changing social norms move forward on how and what will follow

#### Southern Voices and Post-2015

- To date it seems to be mainly a UN and aidagency process – UN, DAC-OECD, UK, Korea
- Vast set of UN and civil society consultations underway but expert report already drafted!
- Post-2015 very different from 1990s very technical and professional – little 'social' action input. Measurement not voice.
- What might the South do?

#### Southern Action

- *Technical* improve content of final deal
- Technical plus refocus final deal on HR or inequality
- Process see engagement with present process as a lever for change...it is not the deal but the way negotiations change relationships
- Get Southern actors in the final deal message entrepreneurs...a Southern icon [Lula]
- Beyond the technical 'stop babies dying now
- Radical a second Seattle...change the game?
