

# Output

 Report provided to the High-level Panel of Eminent Persons (Realizing the Future we want for all; June 2012)

# The High-level Panel (HLP)

### Mandate

 Advise on the Post-2015 development agenda and prepare inputs for the 2013 GA

# Composition

• 26 members, co-chaired by the Presidents of Indonesia and Liberia and UK's Prime Minister

#### **Activities**

 Meetings: New York (Sep 12); UK (Nov 12);
 Liberia (Jan 13); Indonesia (Mar 13); New York (May 13)

## Output

 Report to the UNSG with recommendations on the Post-2015 development agenda (Second quarter of 2013)

## **UNDG Inclusive National Consultations**

# Objective

• To solicit input from citizens and organizations at a country level as part of the preparations for advancing a post 2015 development agenda

# Activities Timeline

- 50 national consultations: South, West and East Africa (19); Asia and Pacific (10); Latin America and Caribbean (9); Arab States (6); Eastern Europe & CIS (6)
- July 2012 First quarter 2013

# Output

 These national consultations will inform the report of the High Level Panel on Post 2015 as well as the subsequent UN Secretary General's official report to the 2013 UN General Assembly (Report due second quarter of 2013)

## **UNDG Thematic Consultations**

#### Activities

 Consultations with academia, media, private sector, employers and trade unions, civil society and decision makers on current challenges to the post 2015 development agenda

#### Content

• 11 themes: inequalities, health, education, growth and employment, environmental sustainability, food security and nutrition, governance, conflict and fragility, population dynamics, water, energy

#### Modalities

 Background papers; Web based consultations; High level leadership meetings

## Output

 Thematic Papers – Final Reports to the HLP (31 March 2013)

# The Open Working Group on SDGs

#### Mandate

 Work further on sustainable development goals – an integral part of the post-2015 development framework

# Composition

• 30 UN member country representatives nominated by different regions

## Output

 Report to the General Assembly during its 68<sup>th</sup> Session (Sept 2013 – Sept 2014) – proposal for SDGs

- Global Call to Action Against Poverty (GCAP)


#### Activities

Goal	Priority areas
1. Promote transformation and sustainable growth	<ul> <li>Prioritize employment creation</li> <li>Promote rural development</li> <li>Promote agriculture, value addition of primary commodities and resources</li> <li>Ensure food security</li> <li>Promote and expand trade, markets and regional integration and investment</li> <li>Prioritize sustainability and support green economy initiatives</li> <li>Increase commitments to multilateral environmental agreements</li> </ul>
2. Promote education and technological innovation	<ul> <li>Strengthen quality and access to basic and tertiary education</li> <li>Invest in secondary, tertiary and vocational education</li> <li>Promote technology transfer</li> <li>Invest in research and development</li> </ul>

Goal	Priority areas
3. Promote human development	<ul> <li>Promote gender parity / empowerment of women in all spheres of endeavor</li> <li>Protect human rights and ensure justice and equality</li> <li>Promote access to social protection</li> <li>Promote maternal and child health</li> <li>Support and empower the elderly and disabled</li> <li>Prioritize disaster risk reduction and climate change adaptation initiatives</li> <li>Promote access to ecosystem services and biodiversity benefit sharing</li> </ul>
